

The following fees and charges are payable for students undertaking a Master of Business Administration, Master of Management, Postgraduate Diploma in Management, Postgraduate Certificate in Management and Single Units commencing in 2012:

**AUSTRALIAN CITIZENS AND PERMANENT RESIDENTS:  
COMPULSORY CHARGES**

- The fee per course unit is AUD3,660.00. Students will be charged on a term-by-term basis for the number of units enrolled in that term.

It is suggested that students allow approximately AUD120.00 per course unit for textbooks.

**FEE-HELP**

FEE-HELP is a loan scheme that assists eligible students to pay their tuition fees. FEE-HELP can cover all or part of a student's postgraduate tuition fees, up to a lifetime limit of AUD89,706.00.

To be entitled to FEE-HELP, you must be:

- an Australian citizen; **OR**
- the holder of a permanent humanitarian visa who will be resident in Australia for the duration of the unit; **OR**
- the holder of a permanent visa who is undertaking a bridging course for overseas-trained professionals and will be resident in Australia for the duration of the unit.

**TEMPORARY RESIDENTS AND INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS:  
COMPULSORY CHARGES**

- There is an application fee of AUD110.00. (Cheque payable to *Macquarie University*.)
- The fee per course unit is AUD3,660.00. Payments are required to be made prior to the nominated deadline.
- 50% of the annual full-time course fee is payable in advance. The documentation required to apply for a student visa (the Confirmation of Enrolment) will be issued after receipt of this payment.
- It is suggested that students allow approximately AUD120.00 per course unit for textbooks.
- Membership of a private health fund is required to obtain a student visa. The University's preferred provider is OSHC Worldcare. The current charge for health cover per annum starts at AUD420.00 for single cover, AUD840.00 for student plus partner and AUD840.00 for family cover. These charges are subject to change and are correct at the date of publication.
- International students must maintain a full-time study load.

**OTHER FEES AND CHARGES**

**Annual Review of Fees and Charges**

MGSM reviews its fees annually and from time to time this will result in increases in the fee per unit. Under normal circumstances these increases would be constrained to 5-10% per annum.

**GST**

Fees are not currently subject to a GST but, in the event of the imposition of any Relevant Tax on higher education, MGSM reserves the right to pass on any such tax to its students. A Relevant Tax is a tax which requires MGSM to comply with any federal, state or local government "Goods and Services" tax imposed or levied.

Candidates should consult their financial adviser on any taxation benefits that may accrue from undertaking a full-fee paying program.

**Payment**

Payments can be made by BPAY, EFTPOS, cheque and all major credit cards.

In the event that a candidate withdraws from a unit of study prior to the relevant withdrawal date, a full refund (credit transfer) is available where the notice of withdrawal is received before the relevant withdrawal date. A full refund (credit transfer) for late withdrawal may also be available where evidence of extenuating circumstances is provided.
