- The Centre for Research on Social Inclusion is working closely with government and community groups on issues such as combating racism, and actively supports postgraduate researchers in this field.

Although both are suitable for students interested in working in multinational corporations or international organisations, the Master of International Relations has a focus on international politics, while the Master of Arts in International Communication explores communication channels and techniques.

Master of Politics and Public Policy (page 12) and Master of Policy and Applied Social Research (page 13)?

While both programs focus on government and the development of policy, the Master of Politics and Public Policy studies the structures and processes involved in the formulation, implementation and evaluation of public policy, while the Master of Policy and Applied Social Research gives its graduates skills to undertake the social research required to assist in the development of these policies.

The Master of International Business has a greater international focus, whereas the Master of Commerce in Business offers you more diversity in the range of units you can study (such as Actuarial Studies, or Commercial Law).

Master of Accounting (Professional) (page 16) and Master of Accounting (CPA Extension) (page 16)?

The Master of Accounting (Professional) meets the requirements for students to continue their professional qualifications with either CPA Australia or the Institute of Chartered Accounting in Australia. The Master of Accounting (CPA Extension) adds one more year of study to the Professional program so that students can complete the CPA Australia professional examinations, supported through classes at university.

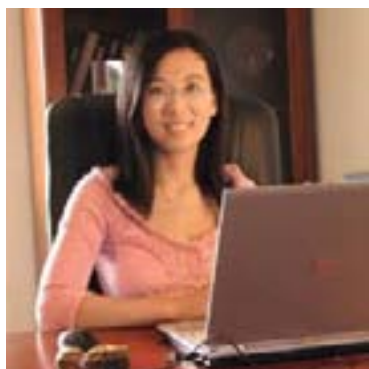

It is two years long with the second year being an internship year, offering IT work experience with two placements in two different companies.
